John Brown and James D. Brown administrators of John Brown (of Benavie Prairie) late of said County due^{to} came into Court and presented & caused to be filed an inventory of the assets of said estate which have come to the hands of the said admr to be administered amounting to the sum of \$161.37. Sixty
One hundred and forty one dollars and thirty seven & one fourth cents which being examined & approved is caused to be filed.

Levi Greene Admr of James Stewart presented to Court here an inventory of
justices appts of said estate amounting to the sum of \$600 or Five thousand
dollars which have come to the hands of said admr to be administered which
being examined & approved by the Court is caused to be filed.

This day came Richard Williams and prayed that letters of administration be
granted to him of the gross chattels and personal estate of Simpson Williams
and it appearing to the satisfaction of the court that the said Simpson
Williams died intestate on or about the 27th day of July 1837 and that Mary
Williams widow & relief of said Simpson Williams has relinquished
her right to have administration of the estate of said Simpson committed
to her.

Whereupon it is granted by the Court that administration of all and singular
the gross and chattels rights and credits which were of the said Simpson
Williams at the time of his death be granted to the said Richard
Williams on his giving bond & security as the law directs.

Also therupon came the said Richard Williams and with Horatio Crammer
Samuel Taylor Joseph Taylor and Sarah Miles his securities bound
him & recd^d from him in the sum of twenty five hundred dollars
executed and made payable as the law directs which bonds & security
were approved by the Court & cause to be filed & recorded.

Letter of Administration on Estate of Dempson Williams
Know all men by these presents that we Richard Williams Mason Currier
Samuel Pigott Joseph A. Taylor & Clara L. wife of the County of Perry and
State of Illinois are held and firmly bound unto the People of the State of Illinois
in the sum of twenty five hundred dollars current money of the United
States which payment will and truly to be made and performed we and each
of us bind ourselves our heirs executors administrators and assigns firmly severally
and jointly by these presents. It witness Our hands and seals this twentieth day
of August 1837

The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the said Richard
Williams administrator of all and singular the goods and chattels rights and
credits of Dempson Williams deceased do make or cause to be made a true
and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods and chattels rights and credits
of the said deceased which shall come to the hands of his executors or knowlege of
him the said Richard Williams as such administrator or to the hands of any per-
son or persons for him, and the same to make or exhibit or cause to be exhibited
in the Court of Probate for the said County of Perry agreeably to law, and such
goods and chattels rights and credits do treat and truly administer according to
law and all the rest of the said goods and chattels rights and credits which
shall be found remaining upon the accounts of the said administrator the same being
just examined and allowed by the court of Probate shall return and pay into such person
or persons respectively as may be legally entitled thereto. And further do make a true and
full account of all his actions and doings therein wherabouts required by said Court and
if it shall hereafter appear that any last will and testament was made by the deceased
and the same be proved in court and letters testamentary or of a administration be
obtained thereon and the said Richard Williams as in such case in full regu-
larly render and deliver up the letter of administration granted to him
as aforesaid and shall in general do and perform all other acts which may
at any time be required of him by law then this obligation to be void, otherwise
to remain in full force and virtue.
