Leagh was the daughter of Benjamin Hylton and Nancy Preston. Nancy was the daughter of Nathaniel Preston who fought in the Revolutionary War. Leagh married James Corder on 26 Aug 1832. Sometime after their marriage they moved to Benton County, MO (land was due south of Warsaw, MO). In the late 1840's they moved to Callaway County. She lived on this farm until she died on 29 Dec 1881. She is buried in Mannen Cemetery. The Cemetery is in a pasture of a farm that was due south of theirs. The cemetery has been overrun by cattle and is not maintained.
